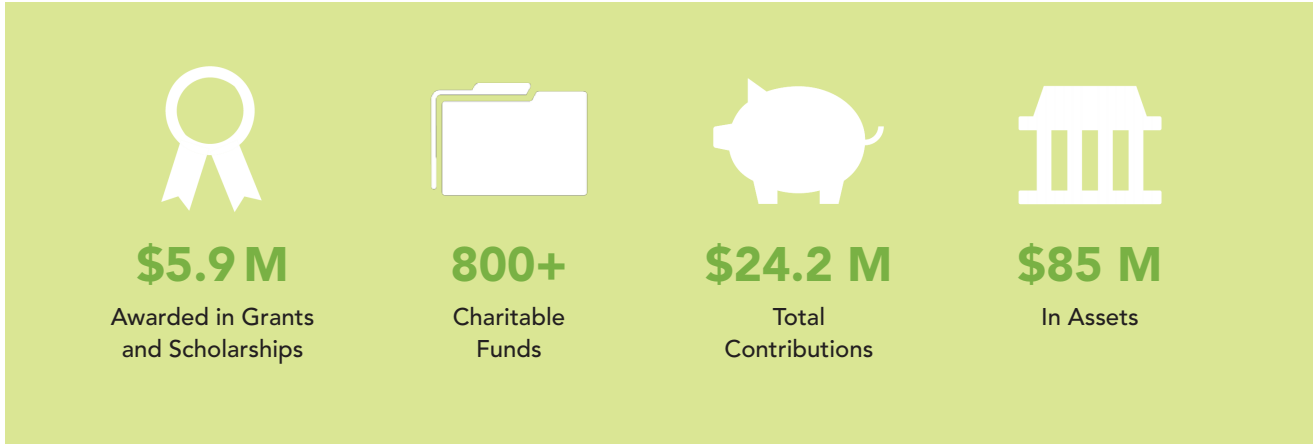

A Letter From the 2021 Board Chair

Although 2021 presented many challenges due to the continuing waves of Covid-19, our community demonstrated a level of generosity that merits celebration. We hope you join us in our **Celebration of Generosity** as you review this report. Here are a few highlights ...

Our 26th Toast to Our Towns Gala was back in person this year after a virtual event in 2020. In addition to our usual honorees, we recognized six Health Care Heroes for providing outstanding leadership at their hospitals during the pandemic. It was great to see everyone again.

The Foundation's total grants and scholarships going to various charities and students reached an all-time high of \$5.9 million, an increase of 9% over our previous record in 2020. Our donor advised fundholders continued their generous grantmaking to their favorite charities with grants totaling \$2.8 million, nearly half of our total grants. And this total is up 47% compared to 2020. With the addition of a record 64 new charitable funds, we now have approximately 300 donor advised funds and are confident that grants from them will set new records again in 2022.

The Foundation was also able to have our Grants Luncheon in person in November. We awarded \$427,323 in grants to 61 local nonprofits through our competitive grants program and celebrated new members of our Heartland Legacy Society.

In its second year, our Job Skills for New Careers initiative supported the good work of Community Services League. The program enabled 94 adults to graduate from certificated trainings that will qualify them to move into a better paying job with a future, a career. We are extremely grateful for our 45 fundholders who supported the program with \$125,000 in grants, as well as the other partners of this work, Mid-Continent Public Library, UCM, and KC Scholars.

As you will see in this annual report, we have much to celebrate regarding the impact your Truman Heartland Community Foundation is making in our community, all made possible by the generosity of our donors. And this impact will continue to grow due to the continued generosity of our donors, who enabled us to receive a record \$24 million in contributions in 2021, shattering our previous record of \$9 million in 2019. In the last week of 2021, the Foundation received the most considerable contribution in its history, a \$10 million gift to their Donor Advised Fund from a couple who have been long-time supporters of the Foundation, raising total contributions from \$14 million to \$24 million.

It was truly an extraordinary year.

As your Community Foundation continues to grow, we look forward to the impact we can make together to build better and stronger communities where everyone can thrive. It was my pleasure to serve as Board Chair of the Foundation during this momentous year. Please join us in our Celebration of Generosity as your review this report.

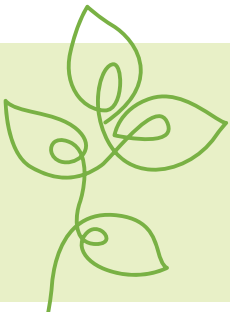
CULTIVATING THE NEXT GENERATION OF LEADERS

Job Skills for New Careers

BRANCHING OUT AND REACHING NEW HEIGHTS

The Job Skills for New Careers initiative is more than a workforce development program. It offers working adults in Eastern Jackson County a concrete path to a higher-paying career. Job Skills for New Careers was created **by** our communities, **for** our communities, to address the needs **of our** communities. Hundreds of conversations and months of research culminated in the program's launch in 2020. And although Covid impacted initial outcomes, this innovative community initiative continues to exceed industry standards.

What makes this program so unique are the collaborative partnerships it created. THCF, Community Services League, KC Scholars, Mid-Continent Public Library, and the University of Central Missouri combined forces to provide local adults with everything they need to get industry-recognized certifications for in-demand careers. Students can focus on reaching their career goals while the program's expanded network of services helps them navigate any barriers encountered along the way. The availability of these wrap-around services enables people to overcome adversity and reach their goals.

Thanks to an initial grant from the Ewing Marion Kauffman Foundation, support from 45 dedicated THCF fundholders, and a new strategic partnership with KC Scholars in 2021, Job Skills for New Careers continues to improve upon past success and grow to meet the community's changing needs.

Life doesn't stop just because a person decides to upgrade their skills. Bills still come due, maintenance is still required, and unexpected expenses will still creep up without warning. The wrap-around services provided by our partners and the flexible funding contributed by THCF fundholders help people remove barriers and find a clear path to success.

Tricia cut her work hours to participate in the program, and a car payment grant helped her continue to get to and from her classes.

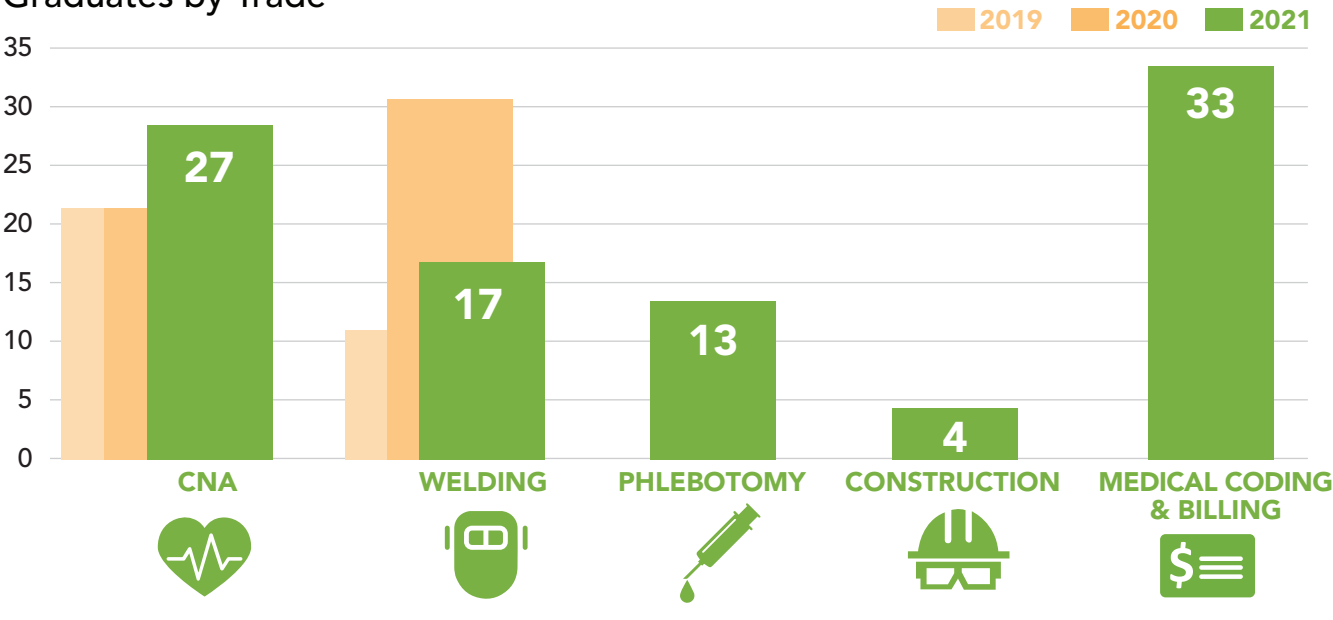

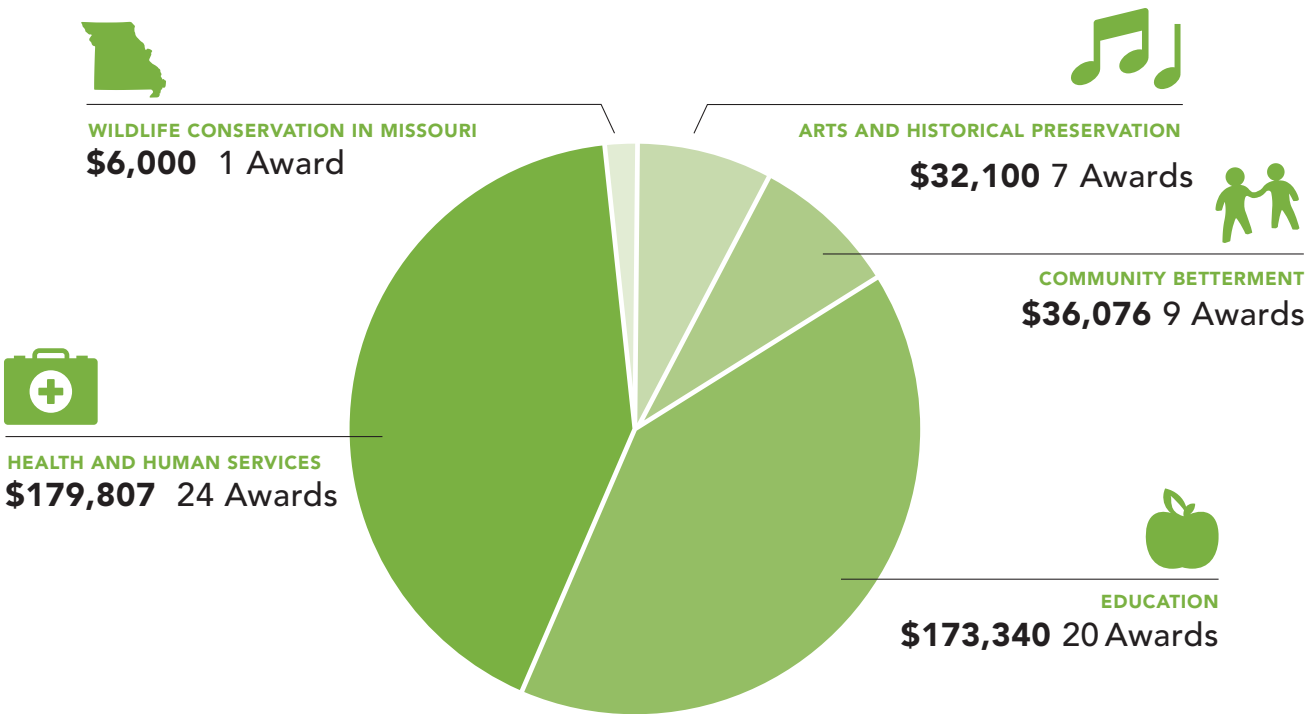
