



t Letter from Our Chair

If you have ever tried to fly a paper airplane a reasonable distance, you know that it doesn't just happen. It takes strategy, from your choice of paper to the flick of your wrist. It involves creativity, your fold sequence dictating flop or flight. And even collaboration, making room for different perspectives and learning from the successes and challenges of others. It takes time. But with dedication and passion, you make progress and then, you fly.

Since our start in 1982, Truman Heartland Community Foundation has made it our mission to connect people, ideas and resources to help the community soar. This past year was noteworthy for several reasons.

It was a record-breaking year for grantmaking. With more than \$4.8 million total granted by fundholders to nonprofits, together we are improving the lives of people throughout the region. Each dollar we invest represents a donor's legacy, a dream for lasting change and an opportunity to make a difference.

In 2019, thanks to the support of our donors, Truman Heartland granted \$306,954 to nonprofits through our competitive grants program, awarded \$319,054 in scholarships to deserving students and worked across the sector to address community needs.

With more than 700 funds, this year Truman Heartland surpassed the \$50 million mark and ended 2019 with assets of \$54.4 million.

Truman Heartland is helping our community overcome challenges, inspiring current and future generations to take flight and lead. We wrapped up a seven-year effort to address critical issues related to aging through the Community for All Ages initiative. And, we launched the Job Skills for New Careers initiative to help provide low-income workers more opportunities to improve their economic status through training and support.

In this annual report, we celebrate the grants, gifts and actions that strengthen our community. There will always be community needs, but with your generosity and our expertise, we are working together to create lasting change and soaring to new heights.







Community For All Ages Coalition

Developing a Model for Collective Impact

Launched in 2011, the Community for All Ages Coalition sought to prepare our Eastern Jackson County community for the challenges and opportunities created by the doubling of the age 65 and older population over the next 20 years.

The Coalition has accomplished some amazing things in the past eight years.

Developed Age-Friendly Communities

Five cities in Eastern Jackson County have been recognized by Mid-America Regional Council (MARC) as **Communities for All Ages**, celebrating the steps they've taken to become more welcoming to residents of all ages. Independence and Lee's Summit have achieved gold-level recognition and Blue Springs, Grain Valley and Raytown are currently recognized at the bronze level.

Improved Access to Transportation

The Coalition provided a forum for city representatives and transportation providers to connect and collaborate. This work will continue with the new **Eastern Jackson County Transit Alliance**, aimed at creating transportation solutions for older adults in several Eastern Jackson County communities.

Connected Volunteers to Local Opportunities

Truman Heartland partnered with the United Way of Greater Kansas City to promote the Get Connected website, a database of volunteer opportunities throughout the region. Additionally, the Coalition provided scholarships and networking opportunities for local volunteer managers and initiated the **Boomers Get Connected** social media campaign, creating an easy, accessible and enjoyable path for people of all ages to volunteer.

Built a Dependable Resource for Caregivers

Now, seniors, caregivers and care managers across the region can find the information and services they need – all on a free and user-friendly website. The site, **Link for Care**, offers a comprehensive database that covers more than 9 counties, 119 cities and 50 transportation services.



Job Skills for New Careers



Helping Break the Cycle of Poverty



The new community initiative, **Job Skills for New Careers**, aims to help improve the economic status of families in Eastern Jackson County and break the cycle of poverty by providing a pathway to higher paying, in-demand careers through job skills training, financial coaching and mentorship.

The result of hundreds of conversations with fundholders and months of research, Job Skills for New Careers is a collaboration with four key organizations: Community Services League, Herndon Career Center, Mid-Continent Public Library and University of Central Missouri.

Using each organization's unique assets, applicants will receive free training in fields that pay living wages and are in high demand in the region, including healthcare, information technology and skilled industrial trades.


